

Editor's Notes

THE function of the Editor as I see it is to gather and arrange the liturgical thoughts of the membership of the Society (and those who address it) for publication. If this is to be done satisfactorily there must be an inflow of thoughts from the Members. The editor will do his own gathering but he would greatly welcome the active co-operation of members of the Society in contributing either full scale articles or in bringing up matters which can be dealt with in shorter notes. While it is not proposed to print correspondence (since the year's gap in publication would make this hopelessly out of date), contributions that are supplementary or corrective of matters of fact can be entertained. From time to time members of sister Societies overseas have contributed valuably and the continuing of such items will be specially welcome.

It happens that the two addresses published this year deal with highly controversial issues and, as the authors are well aware, may not commend themselves to all the membership of the Society. It is hoped that they may stimulate discussion in fraternals and other meetings at which members are likely to be present and with this in view it has been decided to publish the addresses in full so that the trend of the arguments may not be lost. Thanks are due to the authors and to all who have co-operated so willingly to produce this number within the time limits set by the Editor.
