On the evening of Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> January 1886 a meeting was held at 35 Castle Street - the Rev. James Cooper, Messrs Cannichael, Kelly, and Watt, being present - to consult as to the formation of an Ecclesiological Society.

At this meeting a draft constitution was framed.

In consideration of the active part he took in the formation of the Society, the Rev. James Cooper was requested to become President.

Minute of first ordinary meeting

The Rev. the President in the chair &  
the following 9 gentlemen present:-

Messrs. Carmichael, E. W. Japp, W. Kelly,  
W. Mutch, J. D. Philip, and J. C. Watt.  
Apologies for absence were read from  
Mr. William Smith, Rev. George Smith,  
Mr. A. Marshall Mackenzie, and Mr. John  
Smith. Expressions of approval were  
also received from the Rev. Dr. Sprott  
and other gentlemen.

After opening the meeting with prayer  
the Rev. James Cooper gave an intro-  
ductory address on the objects of  
the Society, a copy of which address  
is lodged with the Librarian.

Mr. J. C. Watt was elected Secretary,  
and Mr. W. Mutch Treasurer and  
Librarian.

A number of books and architectural  
photographs were examined and  
discussed by the meeting.

The subject for next meeting was  
settled - namely, "The internal  
treatment of the East End of a  
Church, with the East Parish Church  
as an example".

This being all the business the  
meeting terminated.
